Optional memorial

John de Ribera was born in Seville, Spain, about the year 1532. He studied theology in Salamanca and, shortly after ordination, because of his outstanding virtues, he was made a bishop, first of Badajoz, then of Valencia. He worked for a moral renewal through the establishment of a solid formation for his clergy. He died in Valencia on January 6, 1611.

A true shepherd of his flock

After completing ecclesial studies at the University of Salamanca, John de Ribera was entrusted with the care of the Church at Badajoz, then that of Valence, governing both with great ability and prudence. He was most renowned in Valencia for his holiness and wisdom, perhaps because so many difficult situations were encountered there. In each assignment, he investigated all possible means to help his clergy and the faithful bring their lives, in all aspects, into closer conformity with the Christian faith they professed.

As a beginning, in order to reach the greatest possible number of his faithful, he would continually preach the fundamentals of our religion in a very simple and direct way. He provided for the education of youth in Christian doctrine in the schools and saw to it that good confessors were available to reconcile those who had strayed, and often carried the holy Body of Christ with his own hands as viaticum to the dying.

He worked very diligently and zealously to motivate his priests to holiness, urging them to live a life in common. He frequently gave them group conferences and wrote many pastoral letters in which, by advice, exhortation and logic, he recommended to them a strong daily prayer life, courage in hardships and the preservation of unity among themselves. To insure the continuation of these fervent undertakings, he founded a seminary, and firmly established it with his own legislation. He sought appropriate means to more effectively look after the religious needs of the clergy and people, establishing several commissions and convoking seven diocesan synods to handle major issues of doctrine, discipline and pastoral ministry.

Seeing the interest and zeal of such a sincere and holy bishop, it is easy to surmise how Catholicism experienced such a vital renewal in Badajoz and Valencia under the leadership and guidance of John.

He was prepared by nature for all of these wonderful deeds. Indeed, today the august Trinity seems to present him to us from highest heaven as one of its most perfect works. What an example of a virtuous leader! We urge all faithful Christians, as well as their pastors, to follow in his footsteps.

Indeed, in imitation of him, all those who have been sealed by the sacrament of baptism should value the gift of their Christian faith. They should not only keep it before their eyes, but should also let it reach the very depths of their souls, so that they would rather lose anything, even life itself, than give up the promised reward of eternal life.

ST. VINCENT PALLOTTI, PRIEST Member of the Trinitarian Third Order Optional Memorial

St. Vincent Pallotti was born in 1795. He was an exemplary priest and taught theology in a Roman seminary. He founded the Society of the Catholic Apostolate with the objective that the faith of believers might be strengthened through its charitable works. He died in 1850.

Heirs of God, Heirs with Christ

Trusting in the light given by our holy faith, I address you as did Paul, who assured the Romans that our Lord Jesus Christ was given to us by the Father to be our first-born brother, the first-born of many brothers, the first-born especially among all believers.

Our faith reaches out to the infinite and merciful love of God which has brought countless benefits to us from all eternity in spite of our great and numberless sins. He has only created us all in his image and helped us to merit by the use of our free will, but he has also given us his eternal Son as a Redeemer and the first-born among brothers.

This was done by the Father against whom we had rebelled by sinning. He did it that we might inherit an even closer relationship to him, one in which we become sons of God and heirs, heirs with Jesus. Indeed, Paul says to the Romans, "All who are led by the Spirit of God are sons of God... but if we are children, we are heirs as well: heirs of God, co-heirs with Christ."

Thus, by divine revelation we know that, if we live without grave sin, we are truly sons of God, truly heirs of God and co-heirs with Christ. We have become adopted sons of God, not just sons because we are created in his image; sons of the eternal God, the great, infinite and incomprehensible God.

Therefore, since we are legitimate sons and heirs, we will receive an immense and everlasting inheritance: we will attain to the possession of God himself. The entire Trinity: Father, Son and Holy Spirit, will be our inheritance.

Thus, let us try to be co-heirs with Christ in reality, since he is truly our first-born brother; let us try to be adopted sons of God in reality. In that way, we will claim that same eternal inheritance, as did our Redeemer and first-born brother, Jesus.

ST. AGNES, VIRGIN AND MARTYR

A Patroness of the Order of the Most Holy Trinity

Feast

Saint Agnes died a martyr in Rome during either the second half of the third century or, more probably, at the beginning of the fourth century. Pope Damasus adorned her tomb with sacred poetry, and many of the Father of the Church, following Saint Ambrose, have honoured her in their writings. It was on this day that our holy father John de Matha was moved by a heavenly vision to found the Order of the Most Holy Trinity. In memory of this, St. Agnes is honoured as a principal patroness of the Order.

All over the world, the fragrant presence of Mary stirs up maidens to attain the imperishable crowns by conserving their "royal chamber" of chastity with a pure love and maintaining their integrity until they attain the palm of victory. In this way, young maidens win the prize of holiness, and, following in the footsteps of the Virgin Mother, arrive at the heavenly kingdom.

Thus it is that Agnes, adorned with a ring as a pledge of faithfulness, stands up and cries out that she is bound by love to her Spouse. O virgin, how the example of your love should attract others to imitate you! Oh, how the holy response of your life should stir up a like response in pure hearts: for you turned aside from earthly riches; you were indifferent to the desires of the flesh; you fell in love with the beauty of Christ.

Blessed Agnes has provided a great example of chastity, for she preferred virginity to life; she cast aside all earthly love; she has grasped the Cross of Christ as a trophy; she has struggled with both carnal pleasures and sufferings and has won, armed with faith rather than a sword.

She did not know how to love anything passing; and since she valued her virginity, she did not fear scorn, nor fire, nor torment, nor torturers; at the end, she was not terrified by the sword of her maddened executioner.

Come, then, virgin, to the chambers which you have been seeking; for love of your Spouse, suffer the sword of your executioner so that your unspotted virginity might confirm you as Bride of Christ and your witness under persecution might seal you as a martyr. There is a joyful band of virgins who will be eager to follow in the footsteps of your example. They will receive the crown with you in heaven, for, like you, they will overcome the enemy in the world. We believe that just as you, who followed in Mary's footsteps, share in the eternal reward, so they, imitating you, will not be denied eternal joy.

Therefore, o splendour of Christ, treasure of God the Son, joy of all angels and archangels, be mindful of us. We ask you to intercede for us. May He who granted you the palm of victory for all of your sufferings, grant us the forgiveness of our sins. He reigns with the Father and the Holy Spirit. To Him be honour, praise, glory and might for the ages. Amen.

ST. JOHN BAPTIST OF THE CONCEPTION, PRIEST

Reformer of the Order of the Most Holy Trinity

Feast

Born in 1561 in Almodovar del Campo, Spain, he entered the Order of the Most Holy Trinity in Toledo, and successfully carried out the apostolate of preaching. Moved by the Spirit, he undertook the reform of the Order, which was brought to completion with its approval by Pope Clement VIII in 1599. He died in Cordoba in 1613, and was canonized in 1975 by Pope Paul VI. His many spiritual writings are full of wisdom and piety.

Christ has said that we must leave our parents, deny ourselves, take up our cross and follow after him. I would like to add what was said by the bride in the Song of Songs: "Draw will follow you eagerly in your spreading fragrance". Lord draw me, make me belong to you, and belong to you so much that it can be called the Order of the Most Holy Trinity. Do not let it be content merely with renouncing and disdaining worldly things; but, rather, let it draw the poor and captives, who are constrained by chains or utter misery. But no matter how heavy the burden may seem, Lord, you will give the Order such strength and love that it will be able to follow eagerly after the spread of your fragrance, carrying along its poor and captives. I think those " fragrances" which Christ poured out symbolize the charitable works he exercised when he passed through this world, suffering, caring for the poor and redeeming captives. Our Order, then says: "Draw me after you, Lord, and I will give off the sweet fragrance of your works, springing from a burning love. I will take up care of the poor and captives, and I will eagerly follow after you".

Our holy Order can be compared to Rebakah. She was so full of charity that, when Eliezer asked her for only a little were water, she went beyond what was asked. She gave him to drink and also drew water for his camels. Now the camels represent the charitable works our Order does and is bound to do. Furthermore, it would not be off the subject to recall what that faithful wife did for her son, Jacob. Loving her dear son with all her heart, she wanted to enrich him with the inheritance of his father's blessing: the wheat, the wine and the patrimony to be given to the first-born. She showed a great deal of initiative. She clothed her son with skins so that his hands would appear to be rough; she brought him an appetizing dish, which she had quickly prepared from goats of the flock, to take to his father. In this way he went to Isaac. Then the kind and venerable man, having felt the rough hands of his son and having received the pleasing food, very generously granted him his paternal blessing.

Our Order does the same thing as Rebekah, for it wishes the blessing of Christ –and of the whole Trinity – for its members. It skilfully prepares an offering pleasing to God: the poor and captives. At the same time, the Order enriches spiritually the lives and the work of its members through austerity, simplicity, penance and fasting. By presenting such offerings to the Most Holy Trinity the Order rightly obtains its place and its title of "Order of the Most Holy Trinity for the Redemption of Captives".

The Lord commanded Moses to make an Ark of incorruptible wood; it was last forever and to be plated inside out outside with pure gold, because the Tablets of the Law, the Manna and the Staff of Aaron were to be enshrined within it. Now, should not the brothers of our Order, who are clothed in our holy habit, strive to be pure and holy, since God has enshrined in them the name of the Most Holy Trinity, more sacred by far than the Father wants our salvation. The Father himself testified to this at the Transfiguration when he pointed out his Son and said: "This is my beloved Son who will give you my law: listen to him".

And the Son: is he not symbolized by the Manna?

And the Holy Spirit: is not the Staff kept in the Ark a sing of him?

It was with the Staff that Moses worked miracles and exercised justice, using the same staff for both mercy and justice. It was used for mercy, for it freed the Hebrews, divided the Red Sea, satisfied thirst and worked many other miracles. It was used for justice, for it drowned sinners in the midst of the waves and brought avengers to the aid of the people of Israel, even though these avengers were only flies and frogs. Who does not see in all these things the power of the Holy Spirit, who provides a remedy for the needy, heals the sick, pour forth gifts and brings about justice? It is as Christ said: "When he comes, he will prove the world wrong about sin, about justice and about condemnation". He will be also the avenger, punishing those who did not choose to believe in the Son of God.

Blessed are you, my God. You wanted an ark of such beautiful workmanship to enshrine stone tablets, a little manna rained down from the sky, and a staff which, although miraculous, was only wood. What should be the quality of a religious of our Order, since in him the whole Trinity will be enshrined? It will inhabit our religious – not just in the same way it does all religious, but with a very special presence, since God, in his mercy, has chosen us over other religious as his vessels to carry the name of the Most Holy Trinity throughout the world. This name contains in itself all Three Persons: the Father, who wrote with his finger on the stone, which is Christ; the Son, who is the Manna rained down not by clouds but by a pure young Virgin; and the Holy Spirit, who is the flowering Staff that makes the soul, into which he enters, flourish his seven gifts.

A disciple should carry his own cross following Christ

When Christ was teaching, he asked two things of his followers: that they deny themselves and that they take up the cross. If we consider the matter carefully, both seem to be the same thing. The heaviest cross which anyone can experience on earth is the denial of self, the absolute renunciation of one's own will and a

struggle within one's self against one's selfish desires, much as the two beams of the cross are in contraposition.

Now if the denial of oneself is essentially the same thing the cross, and Christian perfection consists in bearing this cross, why does Christ go on to say that we must take up our cross after having already stated that we must deny ourselves?

In trying to give a reply, I would first say that God usually gives to holy people – after they have completely denied themselves – some interior cross that is known to no one but Himself. Usually God tailors it to fit the person, so that it seems to be part of that person. In such cases, the cross is not seen without the person crucified on it, nor the crucified person without the cross.

In second place I would say that self-denial is an interior cross which persons must take up daily. In addition, God gives each person a special cross which one cannot carry unless he has totally and first denied himself. If one is to be nailed to his cross by his hands and feet – which is to say: if one wishes to be crossed in what he does or desires – he must want to live and suffer for the love of Jesus alone and be ready to accept whatever hardships God may choose to send him. If a person has not already learned to deny himself and instead insists on clinging to his own will, he cannot be nailed to the cross.

My third reply is that Christ speaks of two crosses: one is self-denial, the other is properly called a cross. Thus a person must realize that perfection does not consist only in the cross that he himself has made or has chosen to assume, but also in taking up those other crosses given him by God or imposed on him by other persons.

A fourth reason is that, if a person is already crucified within by perfect self-denial, it is a great sign of love on the part of God to be given an extra cross, which will help that person to bear the first cross, much as one nail con be used to pull out another nail.

Since ordinarily it is the interior cross that is most painful, it can be a special consolation for a person to have also an exterior cross which he can handle and thus distract his attention. Although both are crosses, the fact that they are different helps.

If a person lifts up his hands in the form of a cross, he usually cannot maintain that position for more than a quarter of an hour. However, if he has a cross behind him on which to rest his arms, he can hold the position for several hours. In much the same way, God is accustomed to give an exterior cross to one who is carrying an interior cross to help him in bearing the hardship. Thus, when Christ taught us to follow after him, he did not stop merely at demanding self-denial, an interior cross; he also advised us to take up some external cross, which would sustain us in our internal struggles and sufferings.

Born in Cadiz, Spain, in 1743, he joined the Capuchin Friars and became a well-known preacher, travelling throughout much of Spain. Through his fervent preaching of the Word of God and by the example of his holy life, he led men and women to lead holier lives. He was a zealous promoter of devotion to the Virgin Mary and the worship of the Most Holy Trinity. He died on March 24, 1801.

SECOND READING

From the brief of beatification of Didacus Joseph of Cadiz (Leonis XIII Acta XIV, Romae 1895, pp. 106-108) *Apostle of the mystery of the Trinity*

A vast field of activity was opened providentially to Didacus. Having been ordered to preach missions to people, he affirmed that he felt unqualified. Nevertheless, obedient as always to his superiors, he launched into this new apostolate with zeal and dedication.

As he began his travels throughout all of Spain, he spared himself no hardships in preaching the message of divine truth. He depended more on evangelical simplicity to suit those who heard him, rather than on rhetoric. In villages, army posts, cities, centres of learning, and even in meetings with university professors, he moved everyone and stirred them to a more devout life.

It can easily be seen how much God assisted Didacus with special favors in his fruitful ministry: he who had difficulties in speech and a limited education was now astounding everyone beyond all expectations by his eloquence and wisdom. But, in addition to these gifts, he brought an intensely holy life to his apostolate. Indeed, he was on fire with zeal for the glory of God and the good of souls, hurrying from the pulpit to the confessional to reconcile sinners, Then spending the remainder of the day instructing children, convinced that he would be truly blessed if he could meet death while engaged in these labours.

He would pass the night in prayer and meditation; and when at last sleep would overcome him, he would be kneeling on the floor, his head resting on a hard bed, as he renewed his strength for a short while and so be able to enter anew into battle for the Lord. What can we say about this heroic man's love for the Virgin Mother of God, whom he always very tenderly honoured under the title of Queen of Peace and Mother of the Good Shepherd? What comment can we make on his extremely intense and outstanding devotion to the undivided Trinity, whose glories he preached in such profound the apostle of that great Mystery? Enough will have been said about the deep piety of Didacus if we add but one more detail: whenever he finished preaching a sermon on the love of God, he was so overtaken with emotion that he was unable to come down from the pulpit without assistance.

To this very day there are in Spain shrines to the August Trinity and pious charitable organizations in many places which were established by Didacus. And his published writings, full of wisdom and Christian simplicity, serve as a reminder to later generations of the religious fervour which he stirred up when social changes and upheavals were undermining faith.

True pilgrimage of the Lord

Once people make up their minds to live a more perfect life, it is most beneficial for them to pay attention to the words of the Gospel in everything they do. As a builder uses a rule to align and straighten up a more perfect life makes use of a rule of life which is unerring and appropriate. Such a rule for a more perfect life is the Gospel.

Thus, if someone has chosen a life of solitude and prayer, and the idea occurs to him, as a part of his devotion, to visit the holy places in Jerusalem where one can see where the Lord was, he should consider whether he is being led by the Gospel in this, so that his project may be undertaken according to the teachings of the Lord. If it is not so, I really do not know what could be driving and motivating him in it, for he will be making up a rule himself. Indeed, even though the project has some merits, it should not cause such excessive eagerness and enthusiasm. Truly, if under more attentive investigation, such a pilgrimage would seem to cause spiritual damage to one who is supposed to be living a life of perfection, it should be not only avoided but also not desired.

Thus, you who fear the Lord should praise him no matter where you are. It is not necessary to make a pilgrimage to some other place so as to be closer to God; wherever you are, God will come to you, if there is a lodging place in your soul wherein the Lord can come and dwell. However, if your interior is full of unholy thoughts, even though you might be on the Golgotha, or the Mount of Olives, or even in the Church you as he is from unbelievers.

Dearly beloved, advise any one that a truly beneficial pilgrimage is one that leads to God.

TRANSFER OF THE RELICS OF ST. JOHN DE MATHA

Optional Memorial

The body of St. John De Matha was buried with honors at Rome in the Church of St. Thomas on December 21, 1213. In 1655, it was privately brought to Madrid and presented to the Apostolic Nuncio in Spain. At that time, with the approval of Innocent XIII, the Sacred Congregation of Rites confirmed its authenticity by a new examination. The greater part of his remains was transferred to the monastery of the Order in Salamanca on October 9, 1966; another portion was left in the care of the contemplative Trinitarian nuns in Madrid.

BL. DOMINIC ITURRATE, priest Optional Memorial

Dominic was born in Dima (Vizcaya) on May 11, 1901, and after having received a Christian upbringing from his parents, he felt a calling to the religious life and the priesthood. He entered the Trinitarian Order and began to live out intensely its spirituality. Soon after being ordained a priest, he was stricken with incurable consumption. Without sadness or regret, but rather joyfully and lovingly accepting God's will, he resigned himself to sickness, suffering and eventual death. He died on April 7, 1927. His mortal remains now rest in the Trinitarian church in Algorta (Vizcaya), Spain. He was beatified on October 30, 1983 by Pope John Paul II.

Total and constant conformity to the will of God

With the words of the Book of Wisdom, today the Church expresses the love which God embraces all of creation. The love of God is most particularly expressed in the sanctification of every person.

Today the Church rejoices precisely for this reason, that is, because three of her sons, collaborating with the grace of God, have travelled the way leads to sanctity.

One of these is the Trinitarian religious Dominic Iturrate Zubero, born on Spanish soil, in the Basque country. His short life of just 26 years contains a rich message which is made concrete in his constant striving for sanctity. Here are some special characteristics which I would like to summarize.

The faithful fulfilment of God's will was an aim which in him reached very lofty heights, especially during the last years of his life. That is why in 1922 he wrote in his spiritual notebook: "Our obedience to God's will must be total, without reserve and constant". Animated by that spirit and with the authorization of his spiritual director, he vowed to "do always what he would find most perfect", resolving also "never to refuse anything to God our Lord, but to follow His holy inspiration in everything with generosity and joy".

As a Trinitarian religious, his life was deeply affected by the two central principles of the spirituality of his Order: the mystery of the Holy Trinity and the work of Redemption, which engendered in him a life of intense charity.

As a priest, he had a clear idea of his identity as "an intermediary between God and men" and as "a representative of Christ the Eternal Priest". All this enabled him to live every Eucharistic celebration as an act of personal sacrifice, in union with the supreme Victim, on behalf of all God's people.

No less notable was the presence of Mary in the spiritual life of the new Blessed, from his birth until his death. His was a devotion which he lived with great intensity and which he always sought to instill in others, convinced that: "To go to the Son through the Mother is a path both good and sure".

Just these few traits place before us a persuasive model whose virtues are in great demand and are very esteemed in our day. Father Dominic's generous and faithful response to his vocation shows the way by which our generation can also attain its inner identity and sanctification.

Yes! The saints speak of the glory of the kingdom of God. They proclaim the power of Christ's Redemption: the power of the Cross and the Resurrection. They are living witness that the Creator and Father loves all that he made.

Today, we wish to add another model of holiness to the treasury of sanctity which God has given to his Church to cherish in order that the mysterious heritage of our redemption may endure and enliven all future generations of God's people.

In God we live and move and have our being

In order to better understand the nature of this state of "peace of soul", it would be good to note that, just as we see the sky adorned with stars, in the same way, one who arrives at this state is adorned by all types of virtues. In this state, one is so detached from all created things, from all emotions, powerful influences, passions and feelings that – if it were not for a special light that God gives him – he would not believe it possible that anyone could be attached to any of them. The knowledge of God in this state is exceeded only by that of the angels. Indeed, one who has arrived at this degree of holiness can truly be called an "angel" or even more than an angel, for he possesses the qualities of an angel while still living amidst the pains of earth. He is so involved in the things of God and so detached from what is of the senses, that he forgets about himself and is sustained by love alone, which is said to be the nourishment of angels. Although the angels have no bodies, those who arrive at this state still do have them – but they pay no attention to the condition of their bodies, emotions or passions. This flows from their intense absorption which makes them very forgetful of themselves and of all that is not God.

The apostle Paul, who learned from his own experience, confirms what we have said when he writes: "They have the mind of Christ". We can gather from this that those who do arrive at this state do not use their own senses – rather it is God who uses them. Thus, it can be said that they see without seeing, hear without hearing, speak without speaking, and understand without understanding.

Because we have a fallen human nature, we can do nothing good nor perfect of ourselves. However, those who have arrived at the perfection of peace of soul do all things with such a degree of holiness that it seems impossible for them to commit the least imperfection. For this reason, when they see, hear or speak, we say that it is not they who are acting – God is acting in them, using them as his instruments. Their actions are thus exempt from any imperfections.

Christian marriage is a symbol of Christ's union with the Church; indeed, the Apostle Paul calls it a great "mystery". Often, God wishes to show that it is possible, with the help of his grace, to arrive at the heights of sanctity in this state of life, despite any difficulties intrinsic to it.

The Most High willed to manifest this through a humble woman who gave a very precious witness of holiness while involved in the cares of married life and obliged to provide a living for herself and her family by the work of her hands. She fulfilled the roles of a perfect wife and attentive mother so religiously that she fittingly has become a brilliant and outstanding model for all wives and mothers.

She would rise early in the morning and leave home for a nearby church to nourish her piety and be renewed at the Eucharistic feast. Hardly had the day begun when she would be back at home with her family, dedicating herself zealously to her household duties and carrying out the obligations of her state in life. She bore seven children: four boys and three girls. Some died in infancy; those that survived showed by their upright lives and morals what a religious and ideal formation they had received.

But, busy as she was with her duties in providing for her children, this venerable servant of God was in continual meditation on the things of God.

Having turned her home into what appeared to be a shrine, she did not escape insults and slanderous remarks. These she bore fearlessly for love of Christ, forgiving those who offended her and returning good for evil. She was so inflamed with the love of divine love and being taken up with Christ, it cannot be said that, for this reason, she was not attentive to the needs of her neighbors and to the events which affected the city of Rome and the society of her day. She experienced poverty in her own life, yet she never lost an opportunity to come to the aid of the poor. Because of her immense love for God, she would offer herself up as a victim to God's Justice, eager to prevent impending disasters through her ceaseless prayers.

Innocent XI was born in Como, Italy, in 1611. After he earned a degree in civil and canon law in Naples, he moved to Rome, became a cleric, and assumed duties in Vatican Curia. He was made a cardinal and was assigned to the Church of Novara, where he worked as a gentle and good shepherd for those under his care. Summoned to Rome in 1676, he was elected pope and assumed care for the entire Church, guiding it with wisdom and courage during difficult times. He died in 1689 after many hardships and disappointments.

(Innocent XI epistulae ad Principes I, Romae 1890, p. 117)

Unity and charity in the pastoral ministry

We are not unaware of what you are so justly deploring. There is no more urgent or pressing matter weighing on our heart than that of finding some solution and adequate remedy. These are chaotic times, and many have stubborn wills. It seems that the fruits of our efforts will remain mere desires rather than realizable hopes. Nevertheless, we turn our eyes and our hearts to Him who rules the sea and can bring about a calm. Indeed, we feel a profound trust invade our soul when we think that we will be able to accomplish all things in Him who comforts us – not because of ourselves, but because of Him who is working in us.

No matter what happens, we will be attentive and ready in our pastoral office for any occasion to do good. Let everyone understand this about us: although the successful outcome of our undertakings might never materialize, nevertheless, our efforts will not diminish.

In the first place, let us not cease begging the Father of mercies with continual and zealous prayer that he pour out a spirit of humility and Christian charity into the hearts of priests and bishops, who are called to share in our solicitude for the direction of the Church. From such spirit, harmony will ensue among the clergy, which is so necessary to procure the salvation of souls. With such spirit, they will be able to work together amicably to increase God's glory and to successfully cultivate the vineyard of Christ.

They will be able to keep at a distance the deceits of the heretics who, like roving wolves, continue to approach the sheepfold of Christ with new snares. If in labouring so much for a re-establishment of peace in Christendom, we neglect to promote peace among the clergy, who are a most important component of Christian society, we can rightly be accused of failing in our duties.

Following the example and custom of our predecessors, and that of Jesus Christ himself, we conduct ourselves in such a way that we open our paternal heart freely and willingly to anyone who seeks the assistance of the Apostolic See in religious matters. This is what befits the common father of all. And we do so without preferential regard for anyone, unless his or her virtues merits the preferential attention of our pontifical office.

See that all your subjects live in justice and peace, but especially those who have ecclesiastical rank and who belong to religious orders.

Be devout and obedient to our mother, the Church of Rome, and the Supreme Pontiff as your spiritual father. Work to remove all sin from your land, particularly blasphemies and heresies.

In conclusion, dearest son, I give you every blessing that a loving father can give a son. May the Three Persons of the Holy Trinity and all the saints protect you from every evil. And may the Lord give you the grace to do his will so that he may be served and honoured through you, that together in the next life, we may come to see him, love him, and praise him unceasingly. Amen.

Call on Mary whose name means « Star of the Sea »

The Gospel says: "And the virgin's name was Mary". We should speak a little this name which is said to mean "star of the sea". It is most fitting for the Virgin Mother who may well be compared to a star; for, as a star beams forth its rays without any diminution of its own luster, so, too, the Virgin gave birth to a Son with no loss to her virginity. The departing rays do not lessen the star's brightness, nor Mary's Son her inviolate maidenhood. She is, therefore, that noble star risen from Jacob, whose rays give light to the whole world, whose splendour shines in the heavens and penetrates to the lowest places of the earth. She gives light to the earth and warmth to minds more than to bodies. She encourages virtues and stamps out vices. She is, therefore, that illustrious and noble star raised by nature above the wide sea of life. She shines with merits, she enlightens with her example.

You, all of you, who are cast about upon the sea of time, amidst storms and tempests, more than those who walk on life's solid ground, keep your eyes fixed on the brightness of that star if you do not wish to be overwhelmed by those storms. The Holy Ones of God are called martyrs

Although it is true that all saints are holy ones of God, the martyrs are called "the holy ones of God" in a very special way. "Precious in the sight of the Lord is the death of his holy ones". It is evident that David is here speaking of the death of martyrs from the words of the same psalm: "I will take up the chalice of salvation". Indeed, by saying: "Precious in the sight of the Lord is the death of his holy ones", David infers that God attaches a special quality to the death of the martyrs and that He honors and rewards them in a special way. It is also clear that the honor and excellence of martyrs consist precisely in their deaths. The glory of holy lives they lived than in their deaths. Death is natural and common to everyone: however, the holy lives of confessors are not natural nor common to all – rather they are supernatural and divine, and for such reason, they are rewarded with the crown of glory. By contrast, the greatness of martyrs centers in their deaths much more than in their lives. Their laying down their lives for God is the greatest act of all, as the Redeemer himself said: "There is no greater love than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends".

Thus David, by making mention of death, not of life, in this text, and by qualifying such death as precious in the sight of God, clearly shows that he is speaking only of martyrs, whom he calls the holy ones of God.

It is not David alone who honors the martyrs with this title; the Church itself, speaking in the name of God, refers to them in this way: "For you, my holy ones, bitter conflict was your lot in the days of your mortal lives. Now will I grant you the reward you deserve for your sufferings". And elsewhere, "Your holy ones, O Lord, followed a wonderful path, keeping your commandments". And the Church has other such sayings.

There is a reason why the martyrs are called the holy ones of God in a special way. Just as we call those whom the Church canonizes the "holy ones of the Church", and those whom a certain Pope has canonized

the "saints" of that Pope, so too, it is necessary to have as "the holy ones of God" those whom God has designated as such through these words of his Son: "There is no greater love than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends". It is as though Jesus had said that we must not expect anything greater or more heroic of a man than that he should lay down his life for his friends. And this is what the holy martyrs have done. By these very words, then, God has canonized those who have laid down their lives for him. Therefore, they are to be called "holy ones of God".

Place me as a seal on your heart

Whenever anyone embraces Christ in the interior of his heart with a steadfast love, whenever anyone meditates on the mystery of his passion with the idea of imitating it, Christ become a kind of a sachet of myrrh which, according to the words of Holy Scripture, will rest on his heart. Thus, the bridegroom says to the bride, "Set me as a seal on your heart, as a seal on your arm".

Often, when we want to keep something in mind which we do not want to forget, we tie something around our finger or our arm. Whenever we see this sign, the object comes to mind and is in no danger of being forgotten. If someone appears to love Christ, but neglects to do good works, he is like a person who has put the seal of Christ in his heart, but not on his arm. If someone, however, remains cold and unkindled by the fire of divine love, but performs good works, he is like a person who has put the seal of holiness on his arm, but does not manifest the seal of Christ on his heart. In order that this holy soul be sealed by the Spirit of Christ in both places, he must put the seal of Christ on his heart so that he may burn with the fire of his love from the very depth of his being. Then, he must put it also on his arm that he may persist in doing good works.

Paul put Jesus as a seal on his body as well as his arm when he said: "I bear the wounds of Jesus in my body". He put Jesus as a seal on his heart when, in another place, full of thanksgiving, he proclaimed: "God forbid that I should glory, save in the Cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom the world has been crucified to me and I unto the world". Indeed, St. Paul gloried in Christ Jesus Crucified, whose stigmata were impressed on his body and whose seal he bore in his heart.

The heavenly Bridegroom, on his part, places each of his chosen ones as a seal on himself and looks upon them with divine satisfaction. This is what God promised to Zerubbabel, a prince of Judah, when He said: "On that day, I will take you, Zerubbabel, my servant, and I will set you as a signet ring in my sight".

The fruit of prayer is a humble soul

Humility has always been, is, and will always be a very powerful force both in heaven and on earth. We can see that not only in the house of God, which is the Church, are the humble exalted, but also in the world and among the worldly powerful. This outstanding virtue is appreciated by the virtuous, but it is also valued by the wicked, cultivated by the humble and esteemed by the ambitious who lavish praises on a humble person, but loathe an arrogant one.

Thus, St. Bernard teaches that the surpassing value of this virtue consists in the fact that it makes a person acceptable to the proud, to the angels and to God himself. Thus, too, in the writings of St. Thomas, this virtue is given the highest place in his list of virtues.

Whoever is not practicing prayer should dismiss all hope of ever acquiring humility. It is in prayer that God teaches the soul solid humility. As St. Paul affirms, in prayer is found the way by which the eternal Father gives us knowledge of his beloved and humble Son, who is his exact mirror and to whom we should conform ourselves. Just as, when a mirror is placed before you, you discover the flaws of your face, so, too, in prayer and meditation on Our Lord Jesus Christ, you will see your true self, you will humble yourself and you will think less of yourself than your vanity demands. Kneeling and seeing themselves in similar mirrors: the holy patriarch Abraham declared himself to be dust and ashes; Job called himself burnt linen; David, a worm and not a man. What is more than all this, however, is that the most pure Queen of heaven, who was called the Mother of God by the angel, saw herself in this clear mirror and called herself the handmaid of the Lord.

Thus, it can be seen that if you neglect prayer, you cannot know yourself. If you want to know yourself, your origins, your true profile, and if you wish to acquire true humility, you must climb up to the mountain of prayer. From there you will see that kings and kingdoms amount to nothing. From such height the prophet Isaiah cried out: "All mankind is grass, and all their glory like the flowers of the field", and Solomon shouted to the whole world: "Vanity of vanities; all things are vanity". Life is vain; vain are beauty, clothing, flowers, honors and all those who desire these things.

In other words, the law was our monitor until Christ came to bring about our justification through faith. But now that faith is here, we are no longer in the monitor's charge. All of you so Greek, slave of freeman, male or female. All are one in Christ Jesus. forth into our hearts the spirit of his Son which cries out "Abba!" ("Father!"). You are not no longer a slave but a son! And the fact that you are a son makes you an heir, by God's design.

Therefore, just as through one man sin entered the world and with sin death, death thus coming to all men inasmuch as all sinned – before the law there was sin in the world, even though sin is not imputed when there is no law – I say, from Adam to Moses death reigned, even over those who had not sinned by breaking a precept as did Adam, that type of the man to come.

But the gift is not like the offense. For if by the offense of the one man all died, much more did the grace of God and the gracious gift of the one man, Jesus Christ, abound for all. The gift is entirely different from the sin committed by the one man. In the first case, the sentence followed upon one offense and brought condemnation, but in the second, the gift came after many affenses and brought acquittal. If death began its reign through one man because of his offense, much more shall those who receive the overflowing grace and gift of justice live and reign through the one man, Jesus Christ.

To sum up, then: just as a single offense brought condemnation to all men, a single righteous act brought all men acquittal and life. Just as through one man's disobedience all shall become just.

The law came in order to increase offenses; but despite the increase of sin, grace has far surpassed it, so that, as sin reigned through death, grace may reign by way of justice leading to eternal life, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Mary, the Patroness of the Order of the Most Holy Trinity

The Trinitarian religious whose primary duties are to worship the Triune God with a special devotion, to promote this devotion and to aid the needy and those who suffer by performing works of mercy, have honoured the Virgin Mary, the Sacred Vessel of the Holy Trinity, under the title of "Mother of Good Remedy" from the very beginnings of their Order.

Indeed, St. John De Matha, their founder and lawgiver, had a great love for the Virgin Mother of God. He founded and spread this holy Order under her protection and bequeathed to his sons and daughters the heritage of a strong Marian devotion. A singular love for the Mother of God has flourished among these religious throughout the ages, for she continually healed the sufferings of her suppliants; indeed, it still flourishes among them up to the present day.

The General Chapter of 1959, aware that such traditional devotion had become even stronger in the Order, decided to express the desire of all religious of the Order and to petition the Apostolic See that the glorious Virgin Mary, under the title of Our Lady of Good Remedy, be declared the principal, heavenly Patroness of the Trinitarian Order.

We have willingly decided to grant this request, hoping that the friars of the Order will be inflamed to honor the Virgin Mary under this title with an ever more ardent love. We also trust that they, moved by her example, will more intensely commit themselves to bring relief and remedy to the less fortunate.

Therefore, after consulting with the Sacred Congregation of Rites, with full knowledge and mature deliberation, and with the fullness of our apostolic authority, by virtue of this document, we designate and declare the Blessed Virgin Mary, under the title of Good Remedy, to be forever the heavenly, principal Patroness of the whole Order of the Most Holy Trinity, along with St. Agnes, virgin and martyr. The celebration of Our Lady of Good Remedy is to be given all the liturgical honors and privileges which are fittingly accorded to the patrons of religious Orders and Congregations; moreover, we grant the added faculty of celebrating her feast each year on October 8.

THE HOLY REDEEMER

Feast

The devotion to the Holy Redeemer in the Trinitarian Order is closely associated with the redemptive work of the Order and the historical event of 1682 when Spanish Trinitarians ransomed and brought back from Morocco a statue of the Holy Redeemer together with 211 Christian captives. From the time of its ransom, this holy image has been greatly venerated, and it still is in many parts of the Christian world. This feast, already celebrated in the Order for many years, was liturgically approved on December 22, 1787 and confirmed in the liturgical revision of 1973.

SECOND READING

From a sermon by St. Augustine, bishop

(Sermo 134: PL 38, 742-746)

Behold, our redemption is at hand

Who can free us from death and slavery unless he is free among the dead? And who is free among the dead unless he is among sinners without having sin? "Behold, the prince of this world", says our Redeemer; "Behold, the prince of this world is at hand. He has no hold on me". He has a hold on those whom he has deceived, on those whom he has seduced, on those upon whom he has forced sin and death. "He has no hold on me". Come, Lord, Come, Redeemer! Let the captives know you; let the captor flee from you; be a Redeemer for us!

He found me when I was lost. He, against whom the devil can do nothing that he normally does against flesh, found me. The prince of this world found flesh in him. What flesh? Mortal flesh, which he should be able to have a hold on, which he should be able to crucify, which he should be able to kill. You are wrong, Deceiver: the Redeemer does not succumb; you are wrong. You see mortal flesh in the Lord; but it is not sinful flesh; it is in the form of sinful flesh. God sent his Son in the form of sinful flesh: true flesh, mortal flesh, but not sinful flesh.

But why is this? So that by sin, which he certainly did not have in him, he might destroy sin in the flesh. Thus, he was in the form of sinful flesh, but he was not sinful flesh. How will he destroy sin in the flesh by sin? Normally a form takes its name from the thing of which it is a form. Flesh that is in the form of a sinful flesh is called sin, that it might be a sacrifice for sin. The Apostle Paul says "He who did not know sin became sin for us". Thus, God allowed Christ, who did not know sin, to become sin for us. Why is this, brothers? Those who are familiar with the Old Testament Scriptures will understand what I am saying. It is stated not once, but several times in very many places that there are sacrifices for sins. For example, a goat, a sheep or something else is offered for sin; that victim which was offered for sin was called "sin", a sin-offering. Therefore, God allowed him, who did not know sin, to become sin for us; that is, he became a sacrifice for sin. Sin was offered, and sin was taken away. The blood of the Redeemer was poured out, and the bonds of debtors were broken. This is the blood which was poured out for many for the remission of sins. From the "Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy" by the Second Vatican Council

(Nn. 5-6)

The plan of salvation

God, who "wishes all men to be saved and come to the knowledge of the truth", "in many and various ways... spoke of old to our fathers by the prophets". When the fullness of time had come He sent His Son, the Word made flesh, anointed by the Holy Spirit, to preach the gospel to the poor, to heal the contrite of heart, to be a "bodily and spiritual medicine", the Mediator between God and man. For His humanity, united with the person of the Word, was the instrument of our salvation. Thus, in Christ "there came forth the perfect satisfaction needed for our reconciliation, and we received the means for giving worthy worship to God".

The wonders wrought by God among the people of the Old Testament were but a prelude to the work of Christ the Lord in redeeming mankind and giving perfect glory to God. He achieved His task principally by the paschal mystery of His blessed passion, resurrection from the dead, and glorious ascension, whereby "dying, he destroyed our death and, rising, he restored our life". For it was from the side of Christ as He slept the sleep of death upon the cross that there came forth the wondrous sacrament which is the whole Church.

Just as Christ was sent by the Father, so also He sent the apostles, filled with the Holy Spirit. This He did so that, by preaching the gospel to every creature, they might proclaim that the Son of God, by His death and resurrection, had freed us from the power of Satan and from death, and brought us into the Kingdom of His Father. His purpose was also that they might exercise the work of salvation which they were proclaiming, by means of sacrifice and sacraments, around which the entire liturgical life revolves. Thus, by baptism, men are plunged into the paschal mystery of Christ: they die with Him, are buried with Him, and rise with Him; they receive the spirit of adoption as sons "by virtue of which we cry: Abba, Father", and thus become those true adorers whom the Father seeks. In like manner, as often as they eat the supper of the Lord they proclaim the death of the Lord until He comes. For that reason, on the very day of Pentecost, when the Church appeared before the world, "those who received the word" of Peter "were baptized. And "they continued steadfastly in the teaching of the apostles and in the communion of the breaking of the bread and in the prayers... praising God and being in favour with all the people".

From that time onward, the Church has never failed to come together to celebrate the paschal mystery: reading "in all the scriptures the things referring to himself", celebrating the Eucharist in which "the victory and triumph of his death are again made present" and at the same time giving thanks "to God for his unspeakable gift" in Christ Jesus", to the praise of his glory", through the power of the Holy Spirit.

ST. FELIX OF VALOIS, PRIEST

Co-founder of the Order of the Most Holy Trinity

Memorial

St. Felix led the life of a hermit with other hermits near Cerfroid, in the territory of Meaux, towards the end of the twelfth century. When John de Matha arrived there and revealed his intention of founding a religious Order for the redemption of Christian captives, the hermits "offered themselves and all they had to God for establishing the new Order". According to tradition, St. Felix of Valois has been considered a special co-worker of St. John de Matha and, for this reason, co-founder of the Order of the Most Holy Trinity. He is believed to have died around the year 1212.

SECOND READING

From "The Chaste Marriage of the Word and the Soul" by St. Lawrence Justinian, bishop (Cap. 6, post med.: Opera, Lugduni 1568, p. 161)

Whoever desires perfection must build a solitary place within himself

Whoever, following the example of the Lord, desires to win the trophy of victory over his spiritual enemies, should avoid frivolous associations, flee noise and bustle, and move to some place that is set apart. It would be good for him to keep strict watch over his senses.

Indeed, when the mind is distracted by exterior things, it is less able to reflect on interior matters. It cannot be involved in both; thus, it should flee crowds and withdraw to some more remote area, seeking communion with God, so that it may not be corrupted nor be overcome by unforeseen temptations.

Truly, solitude is a friend in time of sadness, the mother of interior peace, the place of contemplation and the retreat for divine visitations. Having learned this through experience when he was tempted, the Prophet

said, "Far away would I flee; I would lodge in the wilderness; I would hasten to find shelter from the violent storm and the tempest" (Ps 55: 8-9). And the friend of the groom, in spite of his young age, followed the directives of the Word, fled the company of all people and took refuge in desert caves, lest he give in to his enemies in the hour of trial, lest he defile the splendour of his innocence by the least stain of sin.

Life in cities is never safe. All sins thrive there: frivolity reigns, envy torments, quarrels disturb, lust dominates, wealth attracts, sensuality entices and the pleasures of the flesh enervate the soul. Only those who attend to their spiritual welfare are able to avoid the shipwreck of their lives.

Let those live in the world who are in love with themselves, those who are not inflamed with a zealous love for striving to acquire virtue. Whoever wants to grow in perfection, whoever generously has no fear of fighting vices and spiritual evils, according to the advice of the Lord, should first renounce all that he has, then he should build within himself a solitary place where he can be attentive to God and carry on a continual spiritual combat, fleeing there even from the company of relatives. He should keep in mind the example of Redeemer who, when he was tempted by the devil, wished to be alone in the desert. After he had won the victory, he allowed people to be with him.

Solitude is always to be loved, although it is not always to be had. Whoever uses it prudently will carry off the glorious trophy of victory over his enemies.

From the sermons of St. Bernard, Abbott (Sermo 4 de Festo Omnium Sanctorum: Opera, Edit. Cisterc. 5, 1968, 354-360)

Eternal life is to know the Most Holy Trinity

Now, with regard to the altar, from under which St. John heard the voices of the saints, in my opinion, it signifies nothing other than the body of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. Hence, the saints are presently in blissful repose under the humanity of Christ on which the very angels desire to look until the day dawns when they shall be placed no longer beneath, but upon the altar. But what have I said? Which of the angels, not to speak of men, shall ever be able to reach, much less transcend, the glory of the humanity of Christ. In what sense, therefore, can it be said that the souls of the saints now resting under the altar shall hereafter be raised above it? Only by vision and contemplation – not by honor or dignity. For then the Son shall manifest himself to us not as now in the form of a servant, but in the form of God, according to his promise. He will also reveal to us the Father and the Holy Spirit, for without that vision nothing could satisfy us; for in this consists "eternal life": that we may know the Father, the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom he has sent, and in them – as is evident – also the Spirit of the Father and the Son.

Passing, then, to talk about us, he will minister unto us, replenishing our souls with the new and heretofore untested delights springing from the contemplation of his unclouded majesty. Hence, St. John the Evangelist says in one of his epistles, "Dearly beloved, we are God's children now; what we will later be has not yet come to light". And he adds, "We know that when it comes to light, we shall be like him, for we shall see him as he is".

Hear, also, the Bride in the Canticle of Canticles, exclaiming with confidence as she stands above the altar: "His left hand is under my head, and his right arm embraces me". That is to say, the beatified soul shall be lifted above the mysteries of Christ's Incarnation and humanity, which is justly called his left hand, and thus the soul will be able to contemplate with greater intensity Christ's divinity and majesty, which are logically called his right hand.

My friends, in that everlasting and blissful beatitude, we shall enjoy our God in three different ways: we shall see him in all his creatures, we shall possess him in ourselves, and – what is incomparably better and sweeter – we shall also contemplate the Trinity in itself, gazing upon its supreme glory with the eye of a pure heart, without any intermediary symbols. For in this shall consist the eternal and perfect life we long for: that we shall know Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit.

SECOND READING

From the sermons of Saint Augustine, Bishop (Sermo 173: PL 38, 937-939) We shall die in the body; but if we have faith we shall live

When we celebrate the anniversary of our departed brothers and sisters, we should keep in mind something that is to be hoped for, and something that is to be feared. What is to be hoped for? "Precious in the eyes of the Lord is the death of his faithful one". And what is to be feared? "The death of sinners is disastrous". Likewise, in hope: "The just shall be in everlasting remembrance" and "He shall not fear an evil report". But there will be an evil report – and nothing can be worse – for those on the left who will hear, "Depart into everlasting fire". The just, on the contrary, shall not fear this evil report. They will be among those on the right, and to them it will be said, "Come, you have my Father's blessing! Inherit the Kingdom!"

In this life, which we live out between the highest good and the worst evil, we should keep in mind what the Gospel says: "Whoever believes in me, though they should die, will come to life". What does it mean to say that "though they shall die, they shall come to life?" It means that, though they die in the body, they will come to life in the spirit. Then Jesus adds, "Whoever is alive and believes in me, will never die". But earlier he says "though they should die" – how then can he say "they will never die?" What he means is that, "Though they should die" in time, "they will never die" in eternity. Thus, the problem is solved, for the words of truth cannot contradict one another, and they have the ability to nourish holy affections.

Thus, though we should die in our bodies, we shall live if we have faith. Our faith in the resurrection of the dead, however, is very different from any belief of the pagans. Thus, the Apostle Paul says, "We would have you be clear about those who sleep in death, friends; otherwise, you might yield to grief, like those who have no hope". It is not that you will not grieve, but rather that you will not grieve like the pagans who have no hope. It is necessary that you grieve, but when you grieve, your hope will console you. How could you not grieve when a body which was living is left motionless with the departure of the soul? What is not seen departs; what remains is seen with sorrow. But if this is the cause of sorrow, there is also consolation for this sorrow. What consolation? "The Lord himself will come down from heaven at the word of command, at the sound of the Archangel's voice and God's last trumpet blast; and those who have died in Christ will rise first. Then we, the living, the survivors, will be caught up with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air". Will this be for a short time only? No! What then? "Thenceforth we shall be with the Lord unceasingly". So, let sorrow disappear when so great is the consolation!

ST. JOHN DE MATHA, PRIEST

Founder of the Order of the Most Holy Trinity

Solemnity

John de Matha was born in Faucon in Provence around the year 1154. He completed his graduate studies with honors at the University of Paris, where he later taught theology. Ordained to the priesthood, he experienced a heavenly vision while offering his first Mass. He quickly realized that he had been destined by the Lord to redeem Christian captives. To attain this objective, he founded the Order of the Most Holy Trinity at Cerfroid in 1194. he wrote the Order's Rule, which was approved by Innocent III on December 17, 1198. Professing the Rule with great zeal, he was very active in redeeming Christian captives and performing works of mercy. In all this, he sought the glory of the Triune God, whose mystery of Love and Redemption he set as the foundation and purpose of his Order. He died at Rome in the house of St. Thomas in Formis on the Caelian Hill on December 17, 1213.

The Lord answered Moses, "Now you shall see what I will do to Pharaoh. Forced by my mighty hand, he will send them away; compelled by my outstretched arm, he will drive them from his land". God also said to Moses, "I am the Lord. As God the Almighty I appeared to Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, but my name, Lord, I did not make known to them. SECOND READING

From a Bull of Pope Innocent III

(Bulla "Operante" 17 dec. 1198, Reg. Vat. Vol. 4, Fol. 126, V)

Servants and ministers of the Trinity

Innocent, Bishop, Servant of the Servants of God, to our beloved son, John, Minister, and the Brothers of the Holy Trinity, our greetings and apostolic blessings.

Placed, as We are, at the summit of the Apostolic See by the efficacious mercy of God, it is our duty to lend our support to upright desires, and make them effective when they stem from the root of charity, especially in the case where what is sought are the interests of Jesus Christ and common good is preferred to personal gain.

When you, beloved son in Christ, Brother John, Minister, had formerly approached our presence and had taken care to indicate humbly to Us your project, which is believed to have come from divine inspiration, petitioning that your intent be strengthened by apostolic protection, We naturally – in order that We might better know that your desire is founded in Christ, without whom no stable foundation can be laid – judged it opportune to send you back, with our letters, to our venerable brother..., the Bishop of Paris, and our beloved son..., the Parisian Abbot of St. Victor, so that, through them, inasmuch as they are thoroughly acquainted with your desire, We could be instructed about your intent and its benefit, about the foundation of your Order and its way of life, and thus give you our assent more assuredly and more effectively.

Since, as We have learned from their letters, it is clear that you seem to seek the interest of Christ rather than your own, and since We wish that apostolic protection assist you, We grant to you and to your successors, by the authority of this document, the Rule according to which you are to live. My son and Minister, the aforementioned Bishop and Abbot have sent to Us, along with their letters, the body of the Rule augmented with those points which We ordered to be added, according to our own judgement and at your request. We mandate that this charter of concession remain inviolate forever. We have also disposed for the sake of evidence and clarity, that the Rule's text be reported in this document.

In the name of the holy and undivided Trinity.

The Brothers of the House of the Holy Trinity are to live in obedience to the prelate of their house – who shall be called Minister – in chastity and without personal possessions.

All things, from whatsoever lawful source they may come, the Brothers are to divide into three equal parts. Insofar as two parts will be sufficient, they are to provide for carrying on the works of mercy, as well as provide for a moderate sustenance for themselves and the required domestics. The third part is to be reserved for the ransom of captives who are incarcerated for the faith of Christ by pagans: with a reasonable prince paid either for their ransom or for the ransom of pagan captives, so that afterwards by a reasonable exchange and in good faith a Christian may be ransomed for a pagan according to the merits and status of the persons.

All the churches of this Order are to be named in honor of the Holy Trinity and they are to be of simple construction...

In conclusion, no one at all is to violate this charter of our concession and disposition or rashly dare to oppose it. Should anyone dare to do so, let him realize that he will incur the wrath of God Omnipotent and of his blessed apostles Peter and Paul.

Issued at the Lateran, on December 17, in the year of the Incarnation of the Lord one thousand one hundred ninety-eight, in the first year of our pontificate.

(Biblio. Nat. Paris.: cod. Ms. Lat. 9753, vol. 10, V)

John saw the Lord Jesus holding the hands of two chained captives

This is the origin and the reason for which this Order of the Holy Trinity and of the Captives was founded, and here is the miracle which inspired its foundation.

There was a certain good cleric, holding a chair of Theology at the University of Paris, named Prevostin, who was held in high esteem as a philosopher. Under his guidance, another young Master studied and attained a chair in Theology in Paris also; his name was John of Provence. He was a man who feared God, serving him day and night. From early childhood, he had made a firm decision to enter an Order, but he did not know clearly which one. He often had to bear ridicule from his companions because he was so zealous in his service of God. Thinking of how he might live in peace with his companions and yet be able to serve God, he decided to seek ordination to the priesthood, which he did so that he would have a logical reason for reciting the Divine Office and spending more time in prayer.

Lovingly and ceaselessly he beseeched the Lord to show him what Order he should join. As the time approached to celebrate his first Mass, he asked the Lord Bishop of Paris, the Abbot of St. Victor of Paris and his mentor, Prevostin, to attend. On the day of the celebration, all the important figures of Paris were present for the occasion. During the Mass, when he got to the consecration of the sacred species, he begged the Lord to show him what Order he should enter for his salvation, if God so willed. Then, when he lifted his eyes to heaven, he saw the majesty of God, and the Lord Jesus holding in his hands two men with chains on their legs: one was black and misshapen, the other while and emaciated. Since he was delaying so long

during the consecration of the sacred species, those who were present, namely the Bishop, the Abbot, Master Prevostin and all others were astounded and kept asking each other what was happening. But, looking up toward heaven, the Bishop, the Abbot and Master Prevostin saw the same vision and glorified the Lord. Then they roused him, and regaining himself, he continued the celebration.

Once the Mass was ended, they questioned him as to what he had seen. He admitted that he had seen the vision and praised the Lord; likewise, those who had also seen it admitted that they had. After reflecting on the meaning of the vision, John, the Bishop of Paris and the Abbot of St. Victor drafted the Rule of Life and the other directives in conformity with the members of the new Order were to live. Later, the Lord Bishop and the others, wishing that the Rule be confirmed by the Lord Pope, wrote to the Lord Pope saying that he could believe the bearer of the letter, and that what he had seen was true. The Bishop gave the letter to Master John of Provence, who quickly as he was able, began his journey and headed toward Rome. But, on the way, he came to a certain place called Cerfroid. Four hermits living there questioned him as to where he was going and why he was heading for Rome. Since they persisted in questioning him, he explained the reason to them. They rejoiced at what they heard, and, providing that he succeeded in his cause of establishing the Order, they offered themselves and all they had to God and the Order. In short, Master John, arriving at the Apostolic See, had an audience with the Lord Pope, and showing him his letters of recommendation, told and explained the vision that he had seen. The Pope did not want to believe him and considered him and considered him and the bishop fools for testifying to such things. John set out for Paris. Not long thereafter, the same vision which Master John had seen appeared to the Lord Pope as he celebrated Mass. He regretted that he had not granted Master John's petition, and sent messengers to call him back, if they could find him. The Lord Pope said, "May the Lord send him back to me".

Indeed, a little later, that holy man again headed for Rome, and in an audience with the Lord Pope, he obtained what he sought.

Thus – thanks be to God – the Order of the Holy Trinity began in the year of our Lord one thousand one hundred and ninety-eight.

(Ep. 1 ad Serapionem 28-30: PG 26, 594-595, 599)

Light, radiance and grace are in the Trinity and from the Trinity

It will not be out of place to consider the ancient tradition, teaching and faith of the Catholic Church, which was revealed by the Lord, proclaimed by the apostles and guarded by the fathers. For upon this faith the Church is built, and if anyone were to lapse from it, he would no longer be a Christian either in fact or in name.

We acknowledge the Trinity, holy and perfect, to consist of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. In the Trinity there is no intrusion of any alien element or of anything from the outside, nor is the Trinity a blend of a creative and a created being. It is a wholly creative and energizing reality, self-consistent and undivided in its active power, for the Father makes all things through the Word and in the Holy Spirit, and in this way the unity of the Holy Trinity is preserved. Accordingly, in the Church, one God is preached, one God who is "above all things" as Father, for he is principle source; he is "through all things" through the Word; and he is "in all things" in the Holy Spirit. Writing to the Corinthians about spiritual matters, Paul traces all reality back to one God, the Father, saying: "Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and varieties of service, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of working, but it is the same God who inspires them all in everyone".

Even the gifts that the Spirit dispenses to individuals are given by the Father through the Word. For all that belongs to the Father belongs to the Son, and so the graces given by the Son in the Spirit are true gifts of the Father. Similarly, when the Spirit dwells in us, the Word who bestows the Spirit is in us too, and the Father is present in the Word. This is the meaning of the text: "My Father and I will come to him and make our home with him". For where the light is, there also is the radiance; and where the radiance is, there too, are its power and its resplendent grace.

This is also Paul's teaching in his second letter to the Corinthians: "The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all". For grace and the gift of the Trinity are given by the Father through the Son in the Holy Spirit. Just as grace is given from the Father through the Son, so there could be no communication of the gift to us except in the Holy Spirit. But when we share in the Spirit, we possess the love of the Father, the grace of the Son and the fellowship of the Spirit himself.

RESPONSORY

Let us adore the Father, and the Son and the Holy Spirit; let us praise and exalt God above all forever.

The Trinity, sacrament of unity and love

The spiritual building up of the body of Christ is achieved through love. As St. Peter says: "Like living stones you are built into a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, offering spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ". And there can be no more effective way to pray for this spiritual growth than for the Church, itself Christ's body, to make the offering of his body and blood in the sacramental form of bread and wine. "For the cup we drink is a participation in the blood of Christ, and the bread we break is a participation in the body of Christ. Because there is one loaf, we who are many are one body, since we all share the same bread". And so we pray that, by the same grace that made the Church Christ's body, all its members may remain firm in the unity of that body through the enduring bond of love.

We are right to pray that this may be brought about in us through the gift of the one Spirit of the Father and the Son. The Holy Trinity, the One true God, is of its nature unity, equality and love, and by one divine activity sanctifies its adopted sons. That is why Scripture says that "God's love has been poured into our hearts by the Holy Spirit he has given us". The Holy Spirit, who is the one Spirit of the Father and the Son, produces in those to whom he gives the grace of divine adoption the same effect as he produced among those whom the Acts of the Apostles describe as having received the Holy Spirit. We are told "the company of those who believed were of one heart and soul", because the one Spirit of the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is one God, had created a single heart and soul in all those who believed.

This is why St. Paul in his exhortation to the Ephesians says that this spiritual unity in the bond of peace must be carefully preserved. "I, therefore, a prisoner for the Lord, "he writes, "beg you to lead a life worthy of your calling, with all humility and meekness and with patience, bearing with one another in love, eager to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. There is one body and one Spirit".

God makes the Church itself a sacrifice pleasing in his sight by preserving within it the love which his Holy Spirit has poured out. Thus the grace of that spiritual love is always available to us, continually enabling us to offer ourselves to God as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to him forever.

(Lumen Gentium, nn. 2-4)

God renews and sanctifies us in his Son through the Holy Spirit

By an utterly free and mysterious decree of His own wisdom and goodness, the eternal Father created the whole world. His plan was to dignify men with a participation in His own divine life. He did not abandon men after they had fallen in Adam, but ceaselessly offered them helps to salvation, in anticipation of Christ the Redeemer, "who is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of every creature". All the elect, before time began, the Father "foreknew and predestined to become conformed to the image of his Son, that he should be the firstborn among many brethren".

He planned to assemble in the holy Church all those who would believe in Christ. Already from the beginning of the world the foreshadowing of the Church took place. She was prepared for in a remarkable way throughout the history of the people of Israel and by means of the Old Covenant. Established in the present era of time, the Church was made manifest by the outpouring of the Spirit. At the end of time she will achieve her glorious fulfilment. Then, as may be read in the holy Fathers, all just men from the time of Adam, "from Abel, the just one, to the last of the elect", will be gathered together with the Father in the universal Church.

The Son, therefore, came on a mission from His Father. It was in Him, before the foundation of the world, that the Father chose us and predestined us to become adopted sons, for in Him it has pleased the Father to re-establish all things. To carry out the will of the Father, Christ inaugurated the kingdom of heaven on earth and revealed to us the mystery of the Father. By His obedience He brought about redemption. The Church, or, in other words, the kingdom of Christ now present in mystery, grows visibly in the world through the power of God.

This inauguration and this growth are both symbolized by the blood and water which flowed from the open side of the crucified Jesus and are foretold in the Lord's words concerning His death on the cross: "And I, if be lifted up from the earth, will draw all men to myself". As often as the sacrifice of the cross in which "Christ, our Passover, has been sacrificed" is celebrated on an alter, the work of our redemption is carried on. At the same time, in the sacrament of the Eucharistic bread the unity of all believers who from one body in Christ is both expressed and brought about. All men are called to this union with Christ, who is the light of the world, from whom we go forth, through whom we live, and toward whom our journey leads us.

When the work which the Father had given the Son to do on earth was accomplished, the Holy Spirit was sent on the day of Pentecost in order that He might forever sanctify the Church, and thus all believers would have access to the Father through Christ in the one Spirit. He is the Spirit of life, a foundation of water springing up to life eternal. Through Him the Father gives life to men who are dead from sin, till at last He revives in Christ even their mortal bodies.

The Spirit dwells in the Church and in the hearts of the faithful as in a temple. In them He prays and bears witness to the fact that they are adopted sons. The Spirit guides the Church into the fullness of truth and gives her a unity of fellowship and service. He furnishes and directs her with various gifts, both hierarchical and charismatic, and adorns her with the fruits of His grace. By the power of the gospel He makes the Church grow, perpetually renews her, and leads her to perfect union with her Spouse. The Spirit and the Bride both say to the Lord Jesus, "Come!".

Thus, the Church shines forth as "a people made one with the unity of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit".

God's plan of salvation

God who "wishes all men to be saved and come to the knowledge of the truth", "in many and various ways... spoke of old to our fathers by the prophets". When the fullness of time had come, He sent His Son, the Word made flesh, anointed by the Holy Spirit, to preach the gospel to the poor, to heal the contrite of heart, to be a "bodily and spiritual medicine", the Mediator between God and man. For His humanity, united with the person of the Word, was the instrument of our salvation. Thus in Christ "there came forth the perfect satisfaction needed for our reconciliation, and we received the means for giving worthy worship to God".

The wonders wrought by God among the people of the Old Testament were but a prelude to the work of Christ the Lord in redeeming mankind and giving perfect glory to God. He achieved His task principally by the paschal mystery of His blessed passion, resurrection from the dead, and glorious ascension, whereby "dying he destroyed our death and, rising, he restored our life". For it was from the side of Christ as He slept the sleep of death upon the cross that there came forth the wondrous sacrament which is the whole Church.

Just as Christ was sent by the Father, so also He sent the apostles, filled with the Holy Spirit. This He did so that, by preaching the gospel to every creature, they might proclaim that the Son of God, by his death and resurrection, had freed us from the power of Satan and from death, and brought us into the kingdom of His Father. His purpose was also that they might exercise the work of salvation which they were proclaiming, by means of sacrifice and sacraments, around which the entire liturgical life revolves.

Thus, by baptism men are plunged into the paschal mystery of Christ: they die with Him, are buried with Him, and rise with Him; they receive the spirit of adoption as sons "by virtue of which we cry: Abba, Father", and thus become those true adorers whom the Father seeks. In like manner, as often as they eat the supper of the Lord, they proclaim the death of the Lord until He comes. For that reason, on the very day of Pentecost, when the Church appeared before the world, "those who received the word" of Peter "were baptized". And "they continued steadfastly in the teaching of the apostles and in the communion of the breaking of the bread and in prayers... praising God and being in favour with all the people". From that time onward, the Church has never failed to come together to celebrate the paschal mystery: reading "in all the scriptures the things referring to Christ Jesus", celebrating the Eucharist in which "the victory and triumph of his death are again made present, and at the same time giving thanks" to God for the unspeakable gift" of his Son, "to the praise of his glory", through the power of the Holy Spirit.

The Holy Spirit renews us in baptism

The Holy Spirit renews us in baptism through his Godhead, which he shares with the Father and the Son. Finding us in a state of deformity, the Spirit restores our original beauty and fills us with his grace, leaving no room for anything unworthy of our appreciation. The Spirit frees us from sin and death, and changes us from the earthly creatures we were, creatures of dust and ashes, into spiritual creatures, shares in the divine glory, offspring and heirs of God the Father who bear a likeness to the Son and are his co-heirs and brothers, destined to reign with him to share his glory. In place of earth, the Spirit re-opens heaven to us and gladly admits us into paradise, giving us even now greater glory than the angels, and by the holy waters of baptism, extinguishing the unquenchable fires of hell.

We creatures are conceived twice: to the human body we owe our first conception, to the divine Spirit, our second. John says, "To all who received him, who believed in his name, he gave power to become children of God. There were born not by human generation, not by the desire of the flesh, not by the will of man, but of God". All who believed in Christ, he says, received power to become children of God, that is, of the Holy Spirit, and to gain kinship with God. To show that their parent was God the Holy Spirit, John adds these words of Christ: "I give you this solemn warning, that without being born of water and the Spirit, no one can enter the kingdom of God".

Visibly, through the ministry of priests, the baptismal font gives symbolic birth to our visible bodies. Invisibly, through the ministry of angels, the Spirit of God, whom even the mind's eye cannot see, baptizes into himself both our souls and bodies, giving them a new birth.

Speaking quite literally, and also in harmony with the words "of water and the Spirit", John the Baptist says of Christ: "He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire". Since we are only vessels of clay, we must first be cleansed with water and then hardened by spiritual fire – for "God is a consuming fire". We need the Holy Spirit to perfect and renew us, for spiritual fire can cleanse us, and spiritual water can recast us as in a furnace and make us into new creatures.

SECOND READING

From the Apostolic Letter "Sacred Vessel of the Holy Trinity" by Pope John XXIII

(AAS LIII, 1961, 602-604)

The Trinitarian religious whose primary duties are to worship the Triune God with a special devotion, to promote this devotion and to aid the needy and those who suffer by performing works of mercy, have honoured the Virgin Mary – Sacred Vessel of the Holy Trinity – under the title of "Mother of Good Remedy" from the very beginnings of their Order.

Indeed, St. John de Matha, their founded and lawgiver, had a great love for the Virgin Mother of God. He founded and spread this holy Order under her protection and bequeathed to his sons and daughters the heritage of a strong Marian devotion. A singular love for the Mother of God has flourished among these religious throughout the ages, for she continually healed the sufferings of her suppliants; indeed, it still flourishes among them up to the present day.

The General Chapter of 1959, aware that such traditional devotion had become even stronger in the Order, decided to express the desire of all religious of the Order and to petition the Apostolic See that the glorious Virgin Mary, under the title of Our Lady of Good Remedy, should be declared the principal, heavenly patroness of the Trinitarian Order.

We have willingly decided to grant this request, hoping that the friars of the Order will be inflamed to honor the Virgin Mary under this title with an even more ardent love. We also trust that they, moved by her example, will more intensely commit themselves to bring relief and remedy to the less fortunate. Therefore, after consulting with the Sacred Congregation of Titles, with full knowledge and mature deliberation, and with the fullness of our apostolic authority, by virtue of this document, we designate and declare the Blessed Virgin Mary, under the title of Good Remedy, to be forever the heavenly, principal patroness of the whole Order of the Most Holy Trinity, along with St. Agnes, virgin and martyr. The celebration of the feast of Our Lady of Good Remedy is to be given all the liturgical honors and privileges which are fittingly accorded to the patrons of religious Orders and Congregations; moreover, we grant the added faculty of celebrating her feast each year on October 8.

The Incarnation is indeed the event which established Mary as the Mother of the Remedy of the world. What a joy for Mary! What a joy that wells up from within her! If a simple shadowy cloud is transformed into something bright, translucent and resplendently beautiful when a ray of sunshine passes through it, how much more glorious must Mary have become when the Sun of Justice passed into her womb? She, who from the very beginning had been full of grace, now overflows with graces. The Virgin exults in this superabundance of grace, knowing that she has become the heavenly Mother of Remedy for all, both angels and men. The orders of Basil, Anthony, Benedict, the Camaldolese, Carthusians, Jeronomites, Dominicans, Franciscans, Carmelites, Mercedarians, Minims, Jesuits – all the Institutes and local churches which flourish in Christendom with a variety of titles and attributes of our Lady – all of them exist for the specific purpose of rendering praise and thanksgiving to the divine Majesty of God. Nevertheless, God willed that our Order should serve as a stimulus to do this under the title of the Holy Trinity and the patronage of Our Lady of Remedy.

The reason for which we should be devoted to blessed Mary is the fact that she is our Mother. "Show yourself a Mother", the Church says in speaking to our Lady in the liturgy. The Lord himself stated, "I am ascending to my Father and your Father". According to this, we are all brothers and sisters in Christ and adopted children of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Saint Augustine asserts that Christ made all the faithful sons and daughters of his Mother at the moment when, from the Cross, he looked toward John, who represented all of us, and said to his Mother, "Woman, this is your son". She merited to be the mother of all the faithful because of her sorrow which were similar to those of childbirth. She loves us intimately and, for this reason, we should love her in return, responding to her love with our love. It is normal for children to love their mothers; how much more should they love a mother of this stature who holds such a great love for all her children.

Another reason moving us to devotion to our Lady is the zeal with which she watches over us from heaven. We should venerate her as our benefactress. Indeed, she is our advocate, the one who brings healing into our lives and the reward of eternal salvation. She even has power to remedy material needs, as can be seen from her mediation at Cana in Galilee. When the wine supply was exhausted, she pleaded with Jesus: "My Son, they have no wine. I beg you to provide some for them". She quickly ordered the absolution jars to be filled with water, which the Lord transformed into the best of wine. Saint Augustine, in speaking of the Blessed Virgin Mary, states that, just as she is holier than all the saints, she is also more attentive to all of our needs.

Thus, you who have so many bodily and spiritual needs, in your home and family, have recourse to this Lady who is the Mother of God's Remedy. Say to her, "My Lady, help me; gain for me the forgiveness of my sins, an increase in virtue, safety in my infirmities, remedy and healing to pass through all the trials of this life, and, especially, bring me to eternal life where I might see you and love you even more than I have loved you here on earth".

Mary as a type of the Church

Through the gift and role of divine maternity, Mary is united with her Son, the Redeemer, and with His singular graces and offices. By these, the Blessed Virgin is also intimately united with the Church. As St. Ambrose taught, the Mother of God is a model of the Church in the matter of faith, charity, and perfect union with Christ. For in the mystery of the Church, herself rightly called mother and virgin, the Blessed Virgin stands out in eminent and singular fashion as exemplar of both virginity and motherhood.

For, believing and obeying, Mary brought forth on earth the Father's Son. This she did, knowing not man but overshadowed by the Holy Spirit. She was the new Eve, who put her absolute trust not in the ancient serpent but in God's messenger. The Son whom she brought forth is He whom God placed as the first-born among many brethren, namely, the faithful. In their birth and development she cooperates with a maternal love.

The Church, moreover, contemplating Mary's mysterious sanctity, imitating her charity, imitating her charity, and faithfully fulfilling the Father's will, becomes herself a mother by accepting God's word in faith. For by her preaching and by baptism she brings forth to a new and immortal life children who are conceived of the Holy Spirit and born of God. The Church herself is a virgin, who keeps whole and pure the fidelity she has pledged to her Spouse. Imitating the Mother or her Lord, and by the power of the Holy Spirit, she preserves with virginal purity an integral faith, a firm hope, and a sincere charity.

In the most holy Virgin the Church has already reached that perfection whereby she exists without spot or wrinkle. Yet the followers of Christ still strive to increase in holiness by conquering sin. And so they raise their eyes to Mary who shines forth to the whole community of the elect as a model of all virtues. Devotedly meditating on her and contemplating her in the light of the Word made man, the Church with reverence enters more intimately into the supreme mystery of the Incarnation and becomes ever increasingly like her Spouse.

For Mary figured profoundly in the history of salvation and in a certain way unites and mirrors within herself the central truths of the faith. Hence when she is being preached and venerated, she summons the faithful to her Son and His sacrifice, and to love for the Father. Seeking after the glory of Christ, the Church becomes more like her exalted model, and continually progresses in faith, hope, and charity, searching out and doing the will of God in all things. Hence the Church in her apostolic work also rightly looks to her who brought forth Christ, conceived by the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin, so that through the Church Christ may be born and grow in the hearts of the faithful also. The virgin Mary in her own life lives an example of that meternal love by which all should be fittingly animated to cooperate in the apostolic mission of the Church, and to foster the rebirth of humanity.

Devotion to Mary increases devotion to the Holy Trinity

Mary was involved in the mysteries of Christ. As the most holy Mother of God she was, after her Son, exalted by divine grace above all angels and men. Hence the Church appropriately honors her with special reverence. Indeed, from most ancient times the Blessed Virgin has been venerated under the title of "God-bearer". In all perils and needs, the faithful have fled prayerfully to her protection. Especially after the Council of Ephesus, the cult of the People of God toward Mary wonderfully increased in veneration and love, in invocation and imitation, according to her own prophetic words: "All generations shall call me blessed; because He who is mighty has done great things for me".

As it has always existed in the Church, this cult is altogether special. Still, it differs essentially from the cult of adoration which is offered to the Incarnate Word, as well as to the Father and to the Holy Spirit. Yet devotion to Mary is most favourable to this supreme cult. The Church has endorsed many forms of piety toward the Mother of God, provided that they were within the limits of sound and orthodox doctrine. These forms have varied according to the circumstances of time and place and have reflected the diversity of native characteristics and temperament among the faithful. While honouring Christ's Mother, these devotions cause her Son to be rightly known, loved, and glorified, and all His commands observed. Through Him all things have their being and in Him "it has pleased [the eternal Father] that... all his fullness should dwell".

This most holy Synod deliberately teaches this Catholic doctrine. At the same time, it admonishes all the sons of the Church that the cult, especially the liturgical cult, of the Blessed Virgin, be generously fostered. It charges that practices and exercises of devotion toward her be treasured as recommended by the teaching authority of the Church in the course of centuries, and that those decrees issued in earlier times regarding the veneration of images of Christ, the Blessed Virgin, and the saints, be religiously observed.

Let the faithful remember moreover that true devotion consists neither in fruitless and passing emotion, nor in a certain vain credulity. Rather, it proceeds from true faith, by which we are led to know the excellence of the Mother of God, and are moved to a filial love toward our mother and the imitation of her virtues.

In the bodily and spiritual glory which she possesses in heaven, the Mother of Jesus continues in this present world as the image and first flowering of the Church as she is to be perfected in the world to come. Likewise, Mary shines forth on earth, until the day of the Lord shall come, as a sign of sure hope and solace for the pilgrim People of God.

It gives great joy and comfort to this most holy Synod that among the separated brethren, too, there are those who give due honor to the Mother of our Lord and Saviour. This is especially so among the easterners, who with ardent emotion and devout mind concur in reverencing the Mother of God, ever virgin.

Let the entire body of the faithful pour forth persevering prayers to the Mother of God and Mother of men. Let them implore that she who aided the beginnings of the Church by her prayers may now, exalted as she is in heaven above all the saints and angels, intercede with her Son in the fellowship of all the saints. May she do so until all the peoples of the human family, whether they are honoured with the name of Christian or whether they still do not know their Saviour, are happily gathered together in peace and harmony into the one People of God, for the glory of the Most Holy and Undivided Trinity.
