






Priestly Ordination of Father Bienvenu.

On May 5, 2021, the traditional meeting was held between the General Curia of the Order and the students of the Year of Preparation for Solemn Profession (APPS): Br. Theophilus Chridozie Ntadinobi (Nigeria) and Br. Reich Karen Mouhouanou (Rep. of Congo) accompanied by their Director, Fr. Pedro Aliaga Asensio. The ceremony of presentation of the important service was carried out by the Minister General and the members of various General Secretariats of the General Government of the Order were also present. It was a very enriching experience of building up the fraternal life.





5th Centenary of the Apparition of Our Lady of Help at Cori (Latina).

This year marks the 5th centenary of the apparition of Our Lady of Help. At this time, on May 9, 2021, an important Jubilee year was opened for our Shrine of Our Lady of Help at Cori, which will end in May 2022. Due to Covid-19, it was necessary to reduce holiday activities to the minimum. With the aid of civil protection, the image of the Mother of Help placed in the "car" gave Her presence to the people of Cori, along streets, squares, alleys, and countryside of Cori. May the Mother of Help protect us under her mantle.







The Trinitarian Religious of Valence celebrated 10 years of their presence in Angoulême (France) on May 19. "Witnessing to God the Trinity with prayerful and loving presence" was the theme of the celebration. In fact, they have been called since 2010 by the bishop of the Angoulême diocese, Monsignor Claude DAGENS, to bear witness to a God of Love and Mercy who wants to make people happy. Their mission is open to all those who seek a profound sense of life in the midst of suffering and injury and inner freedom in the communion of the Trinity with their sisters and brothers. Our religious are part of the Trinitarian Fraternity of Angoulême composed of the Trinitarians of Bethany (priests, deacons, and lay people) whose mission is appreciated by the Bishop of Angoulême.

Spiritual Retreat of the Sisters of Rome.






They were initiated into our fraternity after Juliana Essel, the first Gabonese took this step in the Trinitarian laity. The latter has more than ten years of experience in the apostolate with the inmates of the central prison in Libreville (Gabon), where she began her apostolate with Father Ange Mampouya who left us a few years ago.



On May 26, the meeting of the of Trinitarian steering group International Solidarity was held. The meeting was organized on the online platform and there were respective SIT leaders from the USA, South America, Spain, Italy, Canada, France, Africa, Madagascar, India, etc., along with the Father General and the International President of SIT. So also, there were members of the Trinitarian Family and our cloistered nuns.





At this meeting, collaboration with countries where persecution continues like Syria, Iraq, Nigeria, India, China, etc., approved. The "St. John de Matha" Chair on Religious Freedom was also supported again. We hope that this new impulse will bear much fruit in our brothers persecuted because of their faith.

May 30, 2021: Feast of the Most Holy Trinity.

On May 30, the entire Trinitarian family celebrated the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity in joy and thanksgiving to bless and praise God the Trinity.

The Trinitarian mystery of God, which we celebrated in a special way, is a source of comfort, peace, and joy: for it is the Father who wills our salvation; it is the Son who brings it to fulfillment, and it is the Holy Spirit who sets us on the path of faith and communicates to us through love. On the Sunday of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Jesus, the Trinitarian Sisters of Rome organized a day dedicated to persecuted Christians. The Sisters, who belong to the Trinitarian Family that dedicates itself to the persecuted, SIT, wanted to make this day in our Parish of Our Lady of Grace at Fornaci, next to St. Peter's Basilica. In this church,

they offered information and products for sale to help the projects that SIT carries out for our brothers and sisters who suffering persecution in various countries.

India: Admission of Postulants.

Three candidates, Nysal Binoy, Joyal V Jose and Alan Ouseph, entered the Vice-Provinces Postulancy program on June 8, 2021 at 7:15 pm during Evening Prayer at Holy Trinity Ashram in Kasargod. The three Postulants completed their three years of training at Holy Trinity Ashram Minor Seminary, Thrissur, before applying to enter the Postulate.

Rev. Biju Nedumparambil, O.SS.T., the Minister Conventual of the House, received them into the Postulancy program on behalf of the Vice Provincial Minister. We wish Rev. Rinto Mukkattukavunckal. O.SS.T., the new Director of Postulants, all the best in his new responsibility.





Christians in the Gaza Strip are the ones who suffer the most from the ambush between Palestine and Israel.





Father Francis Patton said Christians innocent victims of the violence between Palestinians and Israelis Gaza the Strip. Currently, the group of Christians represents a minority and is composed mainly of Arabs and foreign workers. "They find themselves in the middle of two larger parties fighting each other and ending up crushed.

Suffice it to say that one of the first victims of the rockets fired from Gaza was an Indian woman, an immigrant working as a caregiver. A woman of Christian faith who attended our chaplaincy for Indian Catholics," explained the Custos of the Holy Land, in statements released to the SIR agency of the Italian Bishops' Conference. Patton also denounced that violence "has become a political tool. The absence of the international community only reinforces these extremist positions.

The only voice that has risen vigorously in these days is that of Pope Francis, who is the voice of a spiritual and moral leader who on several occasions has called for moderation, dialogue, and a halt to weapons." Mass bombings and incursions by the Israeli air force on the Gaza Strip are also hitting the homes of Christian families located near the Catholic parish of Sagrada Familia, causing damage to the convent and kindergarten of the Sisters of the Rosary. This was confirmed by Monsignor Giacinto-Boulos Marcuzzo, Patriarchal Vicar of the Latin Patriarchate of Jerusalem for Palestine and the Holy City, in statements to Fides magazine.

In clashes, wars, and disputes, minorities are often the ones who suffer the most because they have no protection anywhere. For this reason, persecuted Christians are often one of the most affected targets and become forgotten victims in international conflicts.

Fr. Juan Justino Feregrino Feregrino of the Delegation of Mexico, passed away suddenly on 1.05.2021 following a heart attack. Fr. Juan Justino was born in Ezequiel Montes Querétaro (Mexico) on 18.07.1957. He entered the novitiate in Ciudad (Mexico) on 01.10.1984; made his first profession in Aguascalientes (Mexico) on 23.11.1985, solemn profession in Ciudad (Mexico) on 4 December 1988, and received the Order of Presbyterate on 24 December 1990 in Ezequiel Montes Querétaro (Mexico). May the Most Holy Trinity, source of infinite mercy, welcome him into the joy of Paradise. R.I.P.

Fr. Carmine Cipollone

Fr. Carmine Cipollone passed away on June 9, 2021. He was born in Avezzano, L'Aquila, Italy, on January 18, 1928, the son of Enrico Cipollone and Filomena Cosimati.

He entered the Order of the Holy Trinity and of the Captives on November 25, 1943, began his novitiate in Palestrina, Rome, Italy. He made his first profession in Rome on November 26, 1944, and made his solemn profession in Anagni on February 3, 1949. He was ordained a priest in Rome on October 26, 1952. Three years after his priestly ordination, he was sent to the Trinitarian mission in Madagascar, where he arrived in June 1955. In 1978, he went to study Missiology in Rome, after his specialization he returned to Madagascar.





The Order sent him to Moramanga in 1981, to continue the construction of the Parish "Shrine of the Holy Trinity, as well as the novitiate house. He was appointed "Master of Novices" from 1984 until 2003. About 55 of the priests and friars of Our Lady of Good Remedy Province (Madagascar) were trained by Fr. Carmine in the novitiate. Fr. Carmine Cipollone was truly a model religious in every way: with love for prayer, with love for study and research, with love for work, and with love for his brothers and his neighbor. A priest and a missionary who offered his life with zeal in ministry. We thank God the Trinity for giving him to us. May he eternally contemplate the face of God the Trinity that he relentlessly sought on earth. R.I.P.
