Teramo (Italy): 60 years of Trinitarian Religious Life of Fr. Giovanni Di Marco



On October 7, 2020, the Holy Eucharist was celebrated in the parish of St. Agnes in the municipality of Corropoli-Teramo to thank God for the 60th anniversary of the Trinitarian religious life of Father Giovanni di Marco (Ninetto). He made his simple profession on October 6, 1960. During his formation, the desire to be a missionary in Madagascar was born in him. After his priestly ordination, he left immediately for Madagascar in 1968 and since then he has been a missionary there for about 50 years (1968 - 2018). Returning to Italy, Fr. Giovanni continued his priestly ministry in the parish of Our Lady of Health in Villa Mosca (Teramo) as assistant parish priest. Thanking him for his testimony, we wish him in this year of grace, his sixtieth anniversary of religious life, health, and strength so that he may always respond promptly to God's call. We ask for the blessing of the Trinity and the protection of the Our Lady of Good Remedy, for him and for his mission.

Spain: Signing of an Agreement with the University Loyola Andalusia (Enlazados 44)

Father Daniel García Camino, the Minister Provincial of the Province of the Holy Spirit, and Gabriel Pérez Alcalá, the Rector of the Loyola Andalusia University, signed an important framework agreement for collaboration in the realization of activities of common interest. This partnership aims to work together to carry out projects and activities that establish and spread Theology; that apply influence in view of social transformation according to the values of the Gospel; that support formation in religious life and deepening in the charism of the different religious congregations; that support education of Christian and ecclesial inspiration; in the training of teachers of primary, secondary and higher education and in strengthening the dimension of the identity and mission of the two institutions.



In addition, both entities have also signed the first specific agreement to collaborate in the celebration of the biennial congresses of Theology that the Order is organizing with the Faculty of Theology in Granada. The Trinitarian Congresses serve to promote reflection, from the Trinitarian charism, on liberation in the present currents of Theology.

Rome: The General Council Meets Archbishop Antoine Audo



Taking advantage of his presence at the General Curia, the General Council met with Bishop Antoine Audo, Chaldean Bishop of Aleppo (Syria), on October 16, to know about the situation in Syria, where the Order supports various projects through the international SIT. Mgr. Antoine sincerely thanked the Council for the welcome and the whole Order for more than 7 years of fruitful collaboration with the Chaldean diocese of Aleppo. The guest

expressed his acknowledgment by recalling some significant projects carried out by SIT International. They are: the reconstruction of schools with the payment of scholarships to Christians; the reconstruction of houses for 10 families in the city of Damascus; and finally, the food aid granted to almost 300 families in the city of Aleppo. In the following, Mgr. Antoine stressed the criticality of the situation in the Middle East.



Outside Syria, some countries like Lebanon are in deep crisis and poverty. He believes that one of the profound political problems of the Muslim world in general is the ability to enter modernity. This would mean accepting to live in a pluralist society, respecting individual freedoms. If on this, the Church has made a profound historical journey with the Second Vatican Council, the following realities remain for Muslims new, which they



perceive as a real threat to the Muslim faith. The Monsignor concluded his testimony, stressing the need to strengthen the presence in these territories, despite the difficulties of all kinds that are encountered there. Because the Lord calls us to this mission, which would not fail to support every action in favor of evangelization. The Minister General, Fr. Luigi Buccarello, reiterated the deep desire of the Order to continue its action in the perspective of our charism. On behalf of the Order, a donation of \in 20,000 was given to Bishop Antoine, in aid of all our Christian brothers and sisters in distress. We hope that many of them will find in this gesture some help, but also an encouragement in such a difficult context.

Annual Conference of the Lay Trinitarians in Italy



The Annual Conference of the Trinitarian Laity in Italy was held in Rome from October 16 to 19, 2020 presided over by the President of National the Trinitarian Laity: Mrs. Dolla Batour El Zoghby, with the participation of the Minister General, Fr. Luigi Buccarello, H.E. Antoine Audo, Bishop of the Chaldean Diocese of Aleppo (Syria) and the Minister Provincial of the Province of St. John De Matha, Fr. Giovanni

Martyr Savina. The laity reflected on: "The Welcoming Woman: the vocation of women in the Church and society in the light of the life of Blessed Anna Maria Giannetti Taigi".



Four days that led them to reflect on the fundamental role and contribution that every woman can offer for the construction of a society that is more just and more attentive to the weak, the poor and the last. Also, the Holy Father, informed of the initiative, wanted to express his warm pleasure with a letter sent to the Secular Order of the Most Holy Trinity. The Conference was almost entirely created by the various speakers in telematic way, being difficult to meet physically for the events related to the Coronavirus pandemic.

Rome-Santa Maria delle Grazie alle Fornaci/Our Lady of Graces at Fornaci

A solemn Mass with Vespers was presided over by the Minister General, Father Luigi Buccarello.

It should be emphasized that this year the week of prayer for Christians persecuted by SIT International has found great enthusiasm in several communities around the world, despite all the difficulties caused by the Covid-19 health emergency.

Rome-Basilica of St. Chrysogonus

In the Basilica of St. Chrysogonus, the community of the General Curia and the community of the Fathers of St. Chrysogonus College together with other religious with all the faithful of the parish during the week celebrated daily Mass with vespers for the persecuted. One of the most important moments was the blessing of the statue of Our Lady of Arabia, by H.E. Mons. Antoine Audo Bishop of Aleppo (Syria). It is a gift from the youth of the parish of St. Areta of the Apostolic Vicariate of Northern Arabia. This statue placed in the chapel of the Most Holy Redeemer in the Basilica of St. Chrysogonus is a copy of the original preserved in Kuwait since 1948. Patron of the Christians of the Arabic Gulf, it is invoked for the protection and fidelity of oppressed Christians.



Gagliano del Capo(Italy)



Following intense days of prayer, the week of prayer for Christians persecuted because of their faith, closed in Gagliano del Capo with a mass presided by H.E. Mons. Angiuli Bishop of Ugento with the concelebration of Mons. Antonio Scopelliti, O.SS.T., emeritus of the Bishop Diocese of Ambatondrazaka in Madagascar, Fr. Giovanni Martire Savina, the Minister Provincial of the Province St. John de Matha, Fr. Franco

D'Agostino, the senior most of the Order, (the only one in the photo with the mask) and other priests. In conclusion of the celebration, the Sit-Italy with the diocesan office for the unity of Christians, at the diocese of Ugento-Our Lady of Leuca, with which it collaborates in various diocesan activities, took the opportunity to distribute prayer brochures and leaflets for the various countries where Christians are persecuted.



Colombia

In Colombia, the novitiate community wanted to have a special thought for what is happening in Chile during this week of prayer. The community observed the week of prayer through the celebration of the Way of the Cross in a special way for reparation for the outrages committed against God by those who use violence to defend their ideologies. They prayed not only for all persecuted Christians in Chile, but also for the conversion of the persecutors.



South Korea



The Trinitarian Community of the Fathers of South Korea the Trinitarian laity united to celebrate the week of prayer for the persecuted Christians. In this context, they experienced a strong feeling of union with all the members of the Order who this week of celebrated prayer. They also wanted to express solidarity with all our brothers and sisters who suffer because of their faith in Christ.

Saints Cosmas and Damian (Italy)

A week of prayer for the persecuted Christians was observed at the Parish of St. Antony of Paduva, Campomaggiore, Saints Cosmas and Damian. Trinitarian Fathers of the Parish community, Trinitarian Laity, Trinitarian Women Religious and faithful of the parish engaged in various functions: the Eucharist, adoration, the holy rosary, prayers of intercession, etc. The week of prayer began on Saturday, October 17 with a small procession.





Every day until October 23, a flashlight was entrusted to various groups. In addition, large posters were printed, exhibited in seven of the most frequented places in the city to inform and make more aware of the persecution of Christians in the world.

Gabon



The week of prayer for persecuted Christians was strongly marked by the events in the Republic of Gabon (Central Africa), in which some areas saw our religious in the forefront. The Trinitarian family in Gabon from its SIT-Africa team lived this week together with the novena requested by the Episcopal Conference as spiritual preparation for the reopening of the Churches on October 25, 2020. For your information, all churches in Gabon have been closed since the first lock down imposed in most countries in March-April. In fact, under the pretext of the law and the search for the welfare of the people in front of Covid-19, the Gabonese government has imposed unjust and unjustifiable restrictions (in the empirical reality of what is lived in Gabon), which

make the practice of the Christian faith practically impossible, to the point of prohibiting the celebration of the Eucharist with communion. Moreover, taking many other drastic measures that have aroused the indignation of those responsible for all religious denominations, in particular the Gabonese Episcopal Conference.

Brazil
